

IATI POLICY

1. Our Policy

The **International Development Law Organization** (IDLO) is committed to transparency and open information, and thus publishes basic data about the organization and its projects in line with the standards of the **International Aid Transparency Initiative (IATI)**, which seeks to increase the transparency of development cooperation, and improve its effectiveness by making information about aid spending easier to access, use and understand.

2. Our Approach

IDLO publishes both organizational and project data in line with the **IATI Standards** through its **IATI registry** in XML format. IDLO's data covers organizational and project data from 2015 onwards, and publication of new data and updates take place once a year based on IDLO's annual audited financial statements.

3. Our Data

At the organizational level:

- Name of the organization
- Organizational identifier
- Organization type
- Total budget
- Recipient country budgets

At the project level:

- Project identification numbers
- Project titles
- Project short descriptions
- Project status
- Project location
- Project sector of work
- Project annual expenditures
- Project donor names

4. Exclusions

IDLO considers data to be open unless it falls within one or more of the following categories that are excluded from publication:

- security information: Information that might affect the safety or security of individual staff, partners, beneficiaries, or its operations
- personal information: specific private information that could be traceable to individual staff or partners is not published unless prior permission is granted.
- commercially-sensitive information: Examples include (but are not limited to) supplier contracts, salary information, consultant fees, and resource mobilization plans.
- confidential internal documents: This includes legal documents as well as information that is subject to confidentiality or non-disclosure agreements with partners or donors.

IDLO will review its exclusion policy on an annual basis and update it to reflect any changes.

5. Licensing

IDLO applies a Creative Commons licensing approach. Data may be used for educational, non-commercial purposes subject to an appropriate acknowledgement of IDLO's ownership.
