Andrea Segrè is full professor of International and Comparative Agricultural Policy at the Alma Mater Studiorum – University of Bologna (since 2000). He served as dean of the Faculty of Agriculture (2005-12), Chairman of the Department of Food Science and Technology (2012-15), president of Fondazione

Edmund Mach Foundation in Trento (2015-20) and of the Bologna Agro-Food Centre (2012-22).

Founder of Last Minute Market, academic spin off, and of Zero Waste Campaign, professor Segrè is now the scientific director of Waste Watcher International Observatory on Food and Sustainability and Special Advisor of the Mayor of Bologna on Urban Food Policies (since June 2022). In 2012 he was awarded with the Pellegrino Artusi International Prize, San Giusto d'Oro Award in 2020 and in 2022 the International Prize Padre Pino Puglisi. He authored a number of scientific articles on international and national Journals, last books: Parole del nostro tempo with Cardinal Matteo M. Zuppi (2020), L'insostenibile pesantezza dello spreco alimentare (2022), Lo spreco alimentare in Italia e nel mondo. Quanto cosa e perché (2023).
