	It is mandatory that the Bidder's Proposal numbering system corresponds with the numbering system used in the body of this RFP. All references to descriptive material and brochures should be included in the appropriate response paragraph, though material/documents themselves may be provided as annexes to the Proposal/response.
	Information which the Bidder considers proprietary, if any, should be clearly marked "proprietary" next to the relevant part of the text and it will then be treated as such accordingly.
 Format, signing sealing, marking and submission of Proposals 	The Proposal shall be signed by the Bidder, or a person or persons duly authorized to bind the Bidder to the contract. The latter authorization shall be indicated by written power-of-attorney accompanying the Proposal.

13. Joint Venture, Consortium, or Association	If the Bidder is a group of legal entities that will form or have formed a Joint Venture (JV), Consortium or Association for the Proposal, they shall confirm in their Proposal that : (i) they have designated one party to act as a lead entity, duly vested with authority to legally bind the members of the JV, Consortium or Association jointly and severally, which shall be evidenced by a duly notarized Agreement among the legal entities, and submitted with the Proposal; and (ii) if they are awarded the contract, the contract shall be entered into, by and between IDLO and the designated lead entity, who shall be acting for and on behalf of all the member entities comprising the joint venture.
	After the Deadline for Submission of Proposal, the lead entity identified to represent the JV, Consortium or Association shall not be altered without the prior written consent of IDLO.

	Previous contracts completed by individual experts working privately but who are permanently or were temporarily associated with any of the member firms cannot be claimed as the experience of the JV, Consortium or Association or those of its members, but should only be claimed by the individual experts themselves in their presentation of their individual credentials.
	JV, Consortium or Associations are encouraged for high value, multi- sectoral requirements when the spectrum of expertise and resources required may not be available within one firm. 	comprise the JV, Consortium or Association shall be subject to the eligibility and qualification assessment by IDLO.
14. Only One Proposal	 The Bidder (including the individual members of any Joint Venture) shall submit only one Proposal, either in its own name or as part of a Joint Venture. Proposals submitted by two (2) or more Bidders shall all be rejected if they are found to have any of the following: a) they have at least one controlling partner, director, or shareholder in common; or b) any one of them receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from the other/s; or c) they have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about, or influence on the Proposal of, another Bidder regarding this RFP process. e) they are subcontractors to each other's Proposal, or a subcontractor to one Proposal also submits another Proposal under its name as lead Bidder. f) or some key personnel proposed to be in the team of one Bidder participates in more than one Proposal received for this RFP process.
15. Late Proposals	Any Proposal received by IDLO after the deadline for submission of Proposals, pursuant to clause <i>Deadline for the submission of Proposals</i> , will be rejected and sent back unopened or destroyed unopened if the return cannot be secured unless the Proposal was sent by email but was not properly received due to issues in IDLO mailing system.
16. Validity Period of Proposals	All Proposals will be valid for 90 days from the deadline for submission of Proposals. In exceptional circumstances IDLO may request the Bidders to extend the validity of the Proposal beyond what has been initially indicated in this RFP. The Bidders shall be invited to confirm the extension in writing, without any modification whatsoever on the Proposal. The Bidders may choose not to extend the validity period of the Proposals upon request of IDLO.



17. Modification and withdrawal of Proposals	The Bidder may modify/withdraw its Proposal after the Proposal's submission, provided that written notice of the withdrawal is received by IDLO prior to the deadline prescribed for submission of Proposals. The Bidder's modification/withdrawal notice shall be prepared, sealed, marked, and dispatched in accordance with the provisions of clause Deadline for Submission of Proposals. No Proposal may be modified nor withdrawn after to the deadline for submission of Proposals. No Proposal may be modified/withdrawn in the Interval between the deadline for submission of Proposals and the expiration of the period of Proposal validity specified by the Bidder in the Proposal Submission Form.
18. Amendment of the proposal	At any time prior to the deadline of Proposal submission, IDLO may for any reason, such as in response to a clarification requested by a Bidder, modify the RFP in the form of an amendment to the RFP. Amendments will be made available to all prospective bidders. If the amendment is substantial, IDLO may extend the Deadline for submission of proposal to give the Bidders reasonable time to incorporate the amendment into their Proposals.

Furthermore, IDLO shall not be obliged to award the contract to the lowest priced offer.
21. Clarification of Proposals	To assist in the examination, evaluation, and comparison of Proposals, IDLO may at its discretion ask the Bidder for clarification of its Proposal. The request for clarification and the response shall be in writing and no change in price or substance of the Proposal shall be sought, offered or permitted.



22. Evaluation of Eligibility and Qualification	 In general terms, Bidders that meet the following criteria may be considered qualified: a) They are not included in IDLO Sanctions lists (EU, US, UN). b) They have a good financial standing and have access to adequate financial resources to perform the contract and all existing commercial commitments, c) They have the necessary similar experience, technical expertise, production capacity where applicable, quality certifications, quality assurance procedures and other resources applicable to the provision of the services required. d) They can comply fully with IDLO General Terms and Conditions of Contract. e) They do not have a consistent history of court/arbitral award decisions against the Bidder; and f) They have a record of timely and satisfactory performance with their clients.
23. Price variation	Bidders shall not vary their prices for any reason after the deadline of the tender and while the Proposal is still valid.
24. Preliminary Screening	IDLO will screen the Proposals' Annex D and E to determine whether they are complete, whether the documents have been properly signed, and whether the Proposals are generally in order. Only Bidders that pass will proceed to Technical Evaluation.
25. Correction of errors	In the event of a discrepancy between the unit price and the total price, the unit price shall prevail, and the total price shall be corrected by IDLO. If the Bidder does not accept the final price based on IDLO's correction of errors, its Proposal will be rejected.
26. Due Diligence	 IDLO reserves the right to undertake a due diligence exercise aimed at determining to its satisfaction, the validity of the information provided by the Bidder. Such exercise shall be fully documented and may include, but need not be limited to, all or any combination of the following: a) Verification of accuracy, correctness and authenticity of information provided by the Bidder. b) Validation of extent of compliance to the RFP requirements and evaluation criteria based on what has so far been found by the evaluation team. c) Inquiry and reference checking with Government entities with jurisdiction on the Bidder, or with previous clients, or any other entity that may have done business with the Bidder. d) Inquiry and reference checking with previous clients on the performance on on-going or contracts completed, including physical inspections of previous works, as necessary. e) Physical inspection of the Bidder's offices, branches, or other places where business transpires, with or without notice to the Bidder. f) Other means that IDLO may deem appropriate, at any stage

27. Responsiveness of Proposals	IDLO will determine the substantial responsiveness of each Proposal to the RFP. For purposes of this Clause, a substantially responsive Proposal is the one which materially conforms to the requirement of the tender and any mandatory terms contained in the Solicitation Documents.
	IDLO's determination of a proposal's responsiveness is based on the contents of the Proposal itself without recourse to extrinsic evidence.
28. Evaluation of Proposal	A two-stage procedure is utilised in evaluating the Proposals after Preliminary Screening has been conducted; with evaluation of the Technical Proposal being completed prior to Financial Proposal being opened and compared.
	The Financial Proposals (Price Schedules) of the overall Proposals wil be opened only for submissions that passed minimum technical score of 490 points of the maximum obtainable 700 points .
	The evaluation will be conducted in accordance with the cumulative analysis method, according to which the Technical and Financia Proposals have pre-assigned weights and pre-assigned maximun number of scores:
	 Technical Proposal -70%, - 700 points maximum, Financial Proposal - 30%, - 300 points maximum.
	Technical Evaluation The technical Proposal is evaluated based on its responsiveness to the Terms of Reference (TOR) as per the evaluation criteria below. The obtainable number of points specified for each evaluation criterior indicates the relative significance or weight of the item in the overal evaluation process.
	Financial Evaluation In the second stage the Financial Proposals of all Bidders who attained a minimum 490 points in Technical Evaluation will be reviewed. The lowest amount for technically qualified Financial Proposal will be awarded maximum 300 points and other Financial Proposals will be awarded points in accordance with the following formula: Financial Proposal score = (Lowest Price / Price under consideration
	x 300.



29. 32. Debriefing	In the event that a Bidder is unsuccessful, the Bidder may request a debriefing from IDLO. The purpose of the debriefing is to discuss the strengths and weaknesses of the Bidder's submission, to assist the Bidder in improving its future proposals for IDLO procurement opportunities. The content of other proposals and how they compare to the Bidder's submission will not be discussed.
33. Payment Terms	IDLO will make payment within 30 days after satisfactory receipt of all goods and upon submission of the invoice by the Supplier.

ANNEX C TERMS OF REFERENCE

West Bank and Gaza – Judicial Training on Commercial Law

A. About IDLO

The International Development Law Organization (IDLO) is an intergovernmental organization exclusively devoted to promoting the rule of law. Established in 1983, IDLO works to enable governments and empower people to reform laws and strengthen institutions to promote peace, justice, sustainable development, and economic opportunity. Its programs, research and policy advocacy cover the spectrum of rule of law from peace and institution building to social development and economic recovery in countries emerging from conflict and striving towards democracy.

The Assembly of Parties is IDLO's highest decision-making body. It is composed of Representatives of all Member Parties, which have joined the Establishment Agreement of IDLO. IDLO currently has 37 Member Parties.

IDLO has its Headquarters in Rome, a Branch Office in The Hague, Liaison Offices for the United Nations in New York and Geneva, and Country Offices in Afghanistan, Armenia, the Bahamas, Burkina Faso, Honduras, Indonesia, Kenya, Kyrgyzstan, Jordan, Liberia, Mali, Mexico, Moldova, Mongolia, Myanmar, Niger, the Philippines, Somalia, Tunisia, Uganda and Ukraine.

The work of IDLO is sustained by a dynamic, diverse, multinational and multicultural workforce, comprised of over 400 employees plus additional personnel in the non-employee category such as consultants and interns. About one fourth of the IDLO workforce is based in its Headquarters in Rome, while the rest are spread across the globe in our Branch and Country offices.

B. Background

IDLO is implementing a project in cooperation with the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD) to strengthen the capacity of the Palestinian judges in commercial law. The project aims to support the High Judicial Council (HJC) and the Palestinian Judicial Institute (PJI) to develop a high-standard self-paced interactive Arabic narrated e-learning course on the selected commercial subjects, and IT support to upload the e-learning course modules onto the PJI's e-learning Moodle platform to ensure sustainability.

As a main component of the project, IDLO will support the PJI to develop a self-paced interactive narrated Arabic e-learning course containing e-learning modules, based on the four (4) handbooks on commercial law. The developed e-learning course will be uploaded in a SCORM compliant format and operated on the PJI e-learning Moodle platform. The objective of the development of the e-learning course modules is to ensure that the capacity development process started under the project will continue through allowing the Palestinian judges and other relevant users to access the developed e-learning course modules on the PJI e-learning Moodle platform and take the training online.



C. Expected Output

IDLO aims to provide technical support efficiently, effectively, with accountability and transparency, and as such, the IDLO's office in Jordan is seeking qualified Service Providers to establish a Contract for Services for the identified period to fulfill the assignment.

The objective of this assignment is to design and develop a self-paced interactive narrated Arabic e-learning course that contains modules based on the four (4) handbooks for the specific topics of commercial law with a focus on (i) commercial acts and disputes and commercial contracts, (ii) commercial negotiable instruments, (iii) bankruptcy and preventive composition, and (iv) banking transactions.

The target audience of the e-learning training course would be judges, legal officers at the courts, PJI employees and other employees as indicated by the HJC and the PJI.

The scope of the assignment is to:

- Design and develop an Arabic e-learning interactive self-paced course containing elearning modules based on existing materials (4 handbooks) using Articulate Storyline 360 with Arabic narration.
- 2. Provide the final e-learning course modules in SCORM 1.2 files (to be uploaded onto the PJI e-learning Moodle platform) and the Articulate Storyline Source files at the end of the project.
- 3. Assist the PJI with uploading the e-learning course modules SCORM 1.2 files onto the PJI e-learning Moodle platform.

The Service Provider is expected to provide the following services:

- a. Familiarize with IDLO's Training methodology, including the completion of IDLO's online Training of Trainers course.
- b. Coordinate with the PJI and IDLO focal points to become familiar with the PJI e-learning Moodle platform, features, and functions.
- c. Prepare a detailed workplan and/or outline, in both English and Arabic, for the development process of the e-learning course modules to be approved by the PJI and IDLO.
- d. Work closely with the subject-matter experts (SMEs) to establish the learning objectives of the overall e-learning course and each e-learning module. Provide guidance and support in developing, videos (when and if needed), quizzes and exercises to reach the objectives. Analyze the determined content through meetings.
- e. Develop storyboards for the e-learning course modules for the PJI and IDLO's review and validation. The e-learning course modules will have the following characteristics:
 - i. They will be designed in compliance with the IDLO's Brand and Visibility Guidelines, including PJI's and donor's logo. Acknowledgement and disclaimer will be also considered.



- ii. They will be interspersed with interactive exercises., quizzes, case studies and videos (when and if needed) to enhance the learning experience.
- iii. They will be in line with the discussions with the SMEs, IDLO partner institutions (*if relevant*) and guidance provided by IDLO managing team.
- f. Present a functional prototype for one e-learning course module (at least 15 slides) after validation of its storyboard by IDLO/PJI.
 - i. The prototype will include basic interface and the on-screen elements, and narration of the e-learning course module using text to speech (TTS).
 - ii. It will be shared with IDLO through a clickable Articulate Review link for IDLO/PJI feedback.
- g. Upon confirmation of the storyboards for the remaining e-learning course modules, proceed to develop each e-learning course module and provide for review and comments in an Articulate Review link.
- h. Produce the e-learning course modules narration in Arabic by:
 - i. Developing the narration script.
 - ii. Identifying and liaising with a mother-tongue professional narrator ensuring quality narration of the entire course. The voice, pace, accent, and level of enunciation will be agreed upon in advance with IDLO managing team through a demo file.
 - iii. Upon final confirmation of all e-learning course modules and transcripts the final narration will be added.
- i. Provide continuous updates to IDLO managing team on progress of assignment and reach out to the SMEs as and when required.
- j. Test the e-learning course modules on the browsers of Chrome, Internet Explorer, Firefox, and Edge.
- k. Roll-out a pilot phase of the uploaded e-learning course modules for two weeks engaging a small group of participants to be designated by the PJI and receive their feedback. The feedback expected by the participants during the pilot phase will relate to minor revisions (i.e., typos, language errors, pictures, and eventual bugs).
- I. Provide IDLO and the PJI with the final e-learning course modules containing narration in the format of SCORM 1.2 files.
- m. Provide IDLO and the PJI with the Source files from Articulate Storyline 360.
- n. Provide a final report in English describing the process and all steps, solutions and measures taken during the development of the e-learning course modules. The final report shall include a section on the roll-out of the pilot phase and received feedback.
