1. General Considerations	<p>In preparing the Proposal, the Bidder is expected to examine the RFP in detail. Material deficiencies in providing the information requested in the RFP may result in rejection of the Proposal.</p> <p>The Bidder will not be permitted to take advantage of any errors or omissions in the RFP. Should such errors or omissions be discovered, the Bidder must notify IDLO.</p>
2. Cost of the Proposal	<p>The Bidder shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of the Proposal.</p> <p>IDLO will in no case be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the solicitation.</p>
3. Currency of Proposals	<p>Proposals shall be nominated exclusively in Honduran Lempiras <i>Note: Local Bidders/Suppliers must comply with any applicable laws regarding doing business in other currencies</i></p>
4. Language of the Proposal	<p>The Proposal and all correspondence and documents relating to the Proposal exchanged by the Bidder and IDLO shall be written in the English language.</p>

<p>12. Format, signing sealing, marking and submission of Proposals</p>	<p>The Proposal shall be signed by the Bidder or a person or persons duly authorized to bind the Bidder to the contract. 13. 14. Only One Proposal	<p>The Bidder (including the individual members of any Joint Venture) shall submit only one Proposal, either in its own name or as part of a Joint Venture.</p> <p>Proposals submitted by two (2) or more Bidders shall all be rejected if they are found to have any of the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) they have at least one controlling partner, director, or shareholder in common; or b) any one of them receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from the other/s; or c) they have the same legal representative for purposes of this RFP; or d) they have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about, or influence on the Proposal of, another Bidder regarding this RFP process. e) they are subcontractors to each other's Proposal, or a subcontractor to one Proposal also submits another Proposal under its name as lead Bidder. f) or some key personnel proposed to be in the team of one Bidder participates in more than one Proposal received for this RFP process. This condition relating to the personnel, does not apply to subcontractors being included in more than one Proposal.
15. Late Proposals	Any Proposal received by IDLO after the deadline for submission of Proposals, pursuant to clause <i>Deadline for the submission of Proposals</i> , will be rejected and sent back unopened or destroyed unopened if the return cannot be secured unless the Proposal was sent by email but was not properly received due to issues in IDLO mailing system.
16. Validity Period of Proposals	All Proposals will be valid for 90 days from the deadline for submission of Proposals. In exceptional circumstances IDLO may request the Bidders to extend the validity of the Proposal beyond what has been initially indicated in this RFP. The Bidders shall be invited to confirm the extension in writing, without any modification whatsoever on the Proposal. The Bidders may choose not to extend the validity period of the Proposals upon request of IDLO.
17. Modification and withdrawal of Proposals	The Bidder may modify/withdraw its Proposal after the Proposal's submission, provided that written notice of the withdrawal is received by IDLO prior to the deadline prescribed for submission of Proposals.

21. Clarification of Proposals	To assist in the examination, evaluation and comparison of Proposals, IDLO may at its discretion ask the Bidder for clarification of its Proposal. The request for clarification and the response shall be in writing and no change in price or substance of the Proposal shall be sought, offered or permitted.
22. Evaluation of Eligibility and Qualification	<p>In general terms, Bidders that meet the following criteria may be considered qualified:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) They are not included in IDLO Sanctions lists (EU, US, UN); b) They have a good financial standing and have access to adequate financial resources to perform the contract and all existing commercial commitments, c) They have the necessary similar experience, technical expertise, production capacity where applicable, quality certifications, quality assurance procedures and other resources applicable to the provision of the services required; d) They are able to comply fully with IDLO General Terms and Conditions of Contract; e) They do not have a consistent history of court/arbitral award decisions against the Bidder; and f) They have a record of timely and satisfactory performance with their clients.

23. Price variation	Bidders shall not vary their prices for any reason after the deadline of the tender and while the Proposal is still valid.
24. Preliminary Screening	IDLO will screen the Proposals' Annex D and E to determine whether they are complete, whether the documents have been properly signed, and whether the Proposals are generally in order. Only Bidders that pass will proceed to Technical Evaluation.
25. Correction of errors	In the event of a discrepancy between the unit price and the total price, the unit price shall prevail and the total price shall be corrected by IDLO. If the Bidder does not accept the final price based on IDLO's correction of errors, its Proposal will be rejected.
26. Due Diligence	<p>IDLO reserves the right to undertake a due diligence exercise aimed at determining to its satisfaction, the validity of the information provided by the Bidder. 28. Evaluation of Proposal	A two-stage procedure is utilised in evaluating the Proposals after Preliminary Screening has been conducted; with evaluation of the Technical Proposal being completed prior to Financial Proposal being opened and compared.

	<p>The Financial Proposals (Price Schedules) of the overall Proposals will be opened only for submissions that passed minimum technical score of 490 points of the maximum obtainable 700 points.</p> <p>The evaluation will be conducted in accordance with the cumulative analysis method, according to which the Technical and Financial Proposals have pre-assigned weights and pre-assigned maximum number of scores:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Technical Proposal -70%, - 700 points maximum, - Financial Proposal - 30%, - 300 points maximum. <p>Technical Evaluation The technical Proposal is evaluated on the basis of its responsiveness to the Terms of Reference (TOR) as per the evaluation criteria below. The obtainable number of points specified for each evaluation criterion indicates the relative significance or weight of the item in the overall evaluation process.</p> <p>Financial Evaluation In the second stage the Financial Proposals of all Bidders who attained a minimum 490 points in Technical Evaluation will be reviewed. The lowest amount for technically qualified Financial Proposal will be awarded maximum 300 points and other Financial Proposals will be awarded points in accordance with the following formula: Financial Proposal score = (Lowest Price / Price under consideration) x 300.</p>
29. Failure to do so may constitute sufficient grounds for the annulment of the award, and forfeiture of the Proposal Security, if any, and on which event, IDLO may award the Contract to the Second Ranked Bidder or call for new Proposals.
32. Debriefing	In the event that a Bidder is unsuccessful, the Bidder may request a debriefing from IDLO. The purpose of the debriefing is to discuss the strengths and weaknesses of the Bidder's submission, in order to assist the Bidder in improving its future proposals for IDLO procurement opportunities. The content of other proposals and how they compare to the Bidder's submission will not be discussed.

33. Payment Terms	IDLO will make payment according to the payment schedule described in this document and upon submission of the invoice by the Supplier.
34. Procurement of Software Data Anonymization

A. About IDLO

International Development Law Organization (IDLO): International Development Law Organization (IDLO): The International Development Law Organization (IDLO) is an intergovernmental organization exclusively devoted to promoting the rule of law. Established in 1983, IDLO works to enable governments and empower people to reform laws and strengthen institutions to promote peace, justice, sustainable development, and economic opportunity.

Its programs, research and policy advocacy cover the spectrum of rule of law from peace and institution building to social development and economic recovery in countries emerging from conflict and striving towards democracy.

B. Background

Information and communication technologies play an increasingly important role in the justice sector: web services, online legislation and case law, the use of electronic files and file sharing within institutions can help to make the justice system accessible, affordable, cost-effective, transparent, and efficient. In addition, electronic systems, together with a solid transparency strategy, can help improve access to public information and the quality of communication between citizens and the country's institutions. COVID-19 has made digital innovation even more imperative to provide continuity to judicial operations and other sectors of justice during and after the pandemic.

In this context, IDLO started a new project in April 2021 to help increase transparency and promote the integrity of the Honduran justice system. The Project "Enhancing Judicial Transparency and Promotion of Public Trust (JTPT)" financed by the International Narcotics and Law Enforcement Affairs Section (INL, for its acronym in English), integrates technical support to six (6) areas of The Judiciary, which includes the creation of a protocol to produce public versions of sentences, task performed by the Jurisprudence Unit of the Electronic Center for Judicial Information (CEDIJ).

The project aims to support the Judiciary to increase judicial transparency, citizen participation through access to information and strengthen the accountability of the justice system to ensure compliance with institutional mandates, national laws, and regulations. international. The project will have a positive impact on the ability of the justice system to maintain the required standards of transparency, integrity, and accountability. IDLO proposes to support efforts to optimize the transparency of the justice system and improve public trust, working with the Judiciary.

To ensure collaboration, IDLO carried out a needs assessment, through executive and technical level meetings with the Judiciary, to identify the gaps and challenges they face in the development and implementation of the strategies and plans established by the law to

ensure transparency. This analysis was based on lessons learned from the Judiciary and incorporates institutional knowledge from evaluations of previous cooperation programs.

C. Expected Output

This RFP is to offer a tool to the Judiciary that meets the need of the Jurisprudence Unit of processing court decisions or rulings and developing public versions under the terms of the Law on Transparency and Access to Information and its Regulations. For this a “SOFTWARE FOR DATA ANONYMIZATION” must be developed, a software that detects sensitive personal data in unstructured files (doc, .docx, .txt, .rtf) and also in structured data; and proceeds -- with the decisions of an operator-- to anonymize, pseudonymize and/or replace them irreversibly and to create a new unstructured file (.txt, .doc., .docx, .pdf).

D. Institutional Arrangement

The consultancy involves working in a blended modality, includes establishing periodic virtual and in-person meetings with the IDLO Honduras program team, as well as periodic visits to the Judiciary to meet with the relevant units (a weekly meeting is mandatory, and depending on the dynamics of work and progress, it may be necessary more than once a week) and will report directly to the IDLO Programs Coordinator at the Honduras Country Office, working closely with the relevant units in the Judiciary.

E. Duration of the Work

The consultancy will last 60 days, from the signing of the contract.

F. Work Location

The consultancy will take place in Tegucigalpa, Honduras.

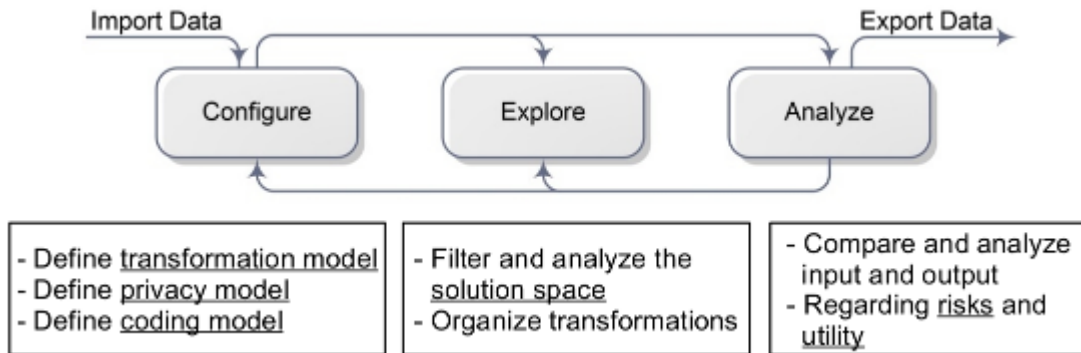
H. Scope of Tender

A. Software for Anonymization Data

This software is mainly aimed at processing court It must facilitate the possibility of inhibition in open and specific searches on the results that the user performs on the anonymized files.

General Overview

The schema below shows the different aspects of the anonymization process that the software should support:



- 1) Configuration privacy models, utility measures and transformation methods:**

In the configuration process, input data can be loaded, transformation rules can be specified and all further parameters, such as privacy models and utility measures, can be selected and parameterized. If required, this step can be prepared by performing a risk analysis.

The data import wizard supports a variety of data sources and allows to specify meta data, such as data types and formats.

The data import also supports the renaming, removing, and reordering. During data import, data types are automatically detected, and data cleansing may be performed.

- 2) Explore the solution space:**

During the anonymization process, the software characterizes a solution space of potential transformations of the input dataset. For each solution candidate it is determined whether risk thresholds are met, and data quality is quantified according to the given model. This perspective allows users to browse the result of this process and to select interesting transformations for further analysis.

After the anonymization process, an overview of potential solutions/results can be inspected in the exploration space. Here, it is possible to search for privacy-preserving data transformations, which result in output data that is suited for the intended usage scenario.

- 3) Analyze data utility**

The utility analysis perspective can be used to assess the suitability of a specific transformation for an anticipated usage scenario. Input and transformed data are displayed side by side.

To assess the usefulness of output data, the utility analysis perspective provides methods for comparing transformed data to input data using information loss

models, descriptive statistics, and application-specific analyses, e.g., focusing on machine learning tasks.

4) **Analyze privacy risks**

Privacy risks can be analyzed for input dataset as well as transformed output data. Based on the results of these analyses, the suitability of a solution candidate may either be confirmed, or the parameters of the anonymization process can be modified, resulting in a real-time automated workflow.
